Context:


- Historically non-existent energy trade between Central Asia (CA) and South Asia (SA)
- Significant energy exchange within CA before, but collapsed
- Late 2000s: Afghanistan's imports from Uzbekistan,
 Turkmenistan and Tajikistan increase dramatically
- Enormous energy reserves in CA and huge demand in SA

Goal:

 Establish a regional energy market to meet SA's growing energy needs with CA's supply while improving energy security in all focus countries



Objective: Enhanced regional cooperation on shared energy and water resources

Activities

- Supporting energy trade (Central Asia plus Afghanistan and Pakistan):
 - CASA-1000 Secretariat (plus additional funding)
- Sector Reforms and Institutional Change:
 - Independent Regulator and Settlement in Kyrgyz Republic (building on work under RESET)
- Electric Company Governance
 - Profitability and efficiency
- Kazakhstan Climate Change Mitigation Program
- Contribution to CAEWDP
- Energy Sector work in Afghanistan and Pakistan
