

Article 6 of the Paris Agreement: A New Era of Carbon Markets






Host country transfers Article 6.2 units (ITMOs) to **buyer country** through a bilateral agreement



Article 6.2

Host country generates units through a UNFCCC centralized mechanism and transfers them to buyer country and other buyers



Article 6.4

Article 6.2 can also involve the private sector under the framework of a bilateral agreement or under "other international mitigation purposes". The Paris Agreement Crediting Mechanism (PACM or Article 6.4) is designed to facilitate the participation of both private and public sectors


Carbon Accounting Under the Paris Agreement





Adjustment made in the transferring country's GHG inventory so that only the tons that are **not exported** are counted towards its NDC.

Adjustment made in the receiving country's GHG inventory so that the tons that are exported are counted towards its NDC.



What is required for participation? All participants must





- 1. Be a Party to the Paris Agreement
- 2. Have prepared, communicated and be maintaining an NDC
- Produce national inventories and track progress toward achieving NDC mitigation targets
- Provide the most recent national inventory report
- Have arrangements for authorizing the export of ITMOs for use toward achieving NDCs or other purposes

- 6. Have arrangements for tracking ITMOs (6.2)
- Demonstrate that their participation contributes to NDC implementation, and
- 8. Demonstrate that participation contributes to their long-term low-emission development strategy, if they have one
- Have designated a national authority for participation (6.4)

All first international transfers of Article 6 carbon credits require corresponding adjustments to avoid double counting of emission reductions

Options for Developing Registry Infrastructure






- Domestic Develop a customized national registry.
- International Registry developed by UNFCCC Secretariat use registry developed by United Nations Climate Change, which will perform functions agreed through negotiated decisions.
- Public good initiatives by international organizations use registry services being developed by international organizations.
- Third party developed infrastructure registry solutions have also been developed as commercial products.

Article 6.2 Reporting Requirements





Participating Parties in Article 6.2 are required to fulfil the three main reporting obligations under the Article 6.2 guidance


