Program Components:

- Covers all supply chain entities but pilot implementation only for **importers and exporters**
- Certification has no expiration, except upon revocation



Accreditation Process:

- Pre-Screening
- 2. Level 1 (90 days from receipt)
- 3. Level 2 (one year from Level 1 accreditation)

- Exemption from Renewal of

- 2. Dedicated Help Desk
- 3. Acceptance of Self-

- 1. Dedicated Processing Lane

- Submit documents via AEO Online Portal






BACKGROUND

Basis:

Article 59 of the ASEAN Trade in Goods Agreement (ATIGA), provides that ASEAN member states shall:

- Endeavour to establish 1. the programme of Authorised Economic Operators (AEO); and
- 2. Further, work towards mutual recognition of AEO.



AEO-MRA among AMS aims to potentially reduce regulatory burden on international trade


