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I. Sector Status Updates

ADB-funded Regional Technical Assistance Project "Developing a Disaster Risk Transfer Facility in the CAREC Region" (\$2.75 million, Nov 2020–Feb 2024)

Identify and quantify flood, earthquake and infectious disease risk

- Disaster Risk Profiles for each CAREC country on flood, earthquake and infectious disease risks
- Compound Risk Analysis on potential joint impacts from disaster events and infectious disease outbreaks

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Provide access to modelling and build capacity on risk reduction and financing solutions

- □ Disaster Risk Modeling Interface (DRMI), allowing stakeholders to visualize risk profiles, perform high-level adaptation cost-benefit analyses; and quantify risk transfer costs for parametric insurance structures
- Regional capacity building and engagement workshops and bilateral consultations







- □ Road Map to Developing a Regional Risk Transfer Facility for CAREC, outlining key considerations and next steps regarding the facility's creation and operation
- Assessment on the issuance of a pilot Disaster Relief Bond by ADB for selected CAREC countries
- Infectious Disease Risk Report, identifying three potential risk financing solutions to help build resilience to future outbreaks



II. Key Priorities or Plans for 2024-2025

- Natural hazard risk and vulnerability expected to increase throughout the region, stretching countries' fiscal capacities to cope with the impacts of disaster events
- Joint Ministerial Statement endorsed at 22nd Ministerial Conference requesting continued support to further advance the design and implementation of the proposed disaster risk financing solutions
- □ CAREC Climate Change Vision: "CAREC can serve as a platform to support the implementation of complementary regional disaster risk management and disaster risk financing initiatives"

^{*} ADB placed its regular assistance to Afghanistan on hold effective 15 August 2021. The initial focus of the pilot disaster relief bond will be selected countries (most likely group A countries eligible to receive Asian Development Fund support), although all CAREC countries will be observers to the pilot issuance process.
